And **WE DO HEREBY CERTIFY THAT** the attached By-Laws and Rules were duly adopted by the Queens Republican Party County Committee and Executive Committee at said meeting held on September 29, 2025:

BYLAWS OF THE QUEENS COUNTY REPUBLICAN COMMITTEE
Adopted September 29, 2025

Article I

General Provisions

Section 1. The County Committee of the Republican Party of Queens County shall be constituted in accordance with the provisions of the Election Law of the State of New York.

Section 2. The County Committee shall have general authority over the Republican Organization of the County and over all sub-committees within its jurisdiction, except where limited or curtailed by law or by these rules and regulations; and it shall fix the time and place within the time limited by law for the organization of the County Committee and all its sub-committees.

Section 3. The unit of representation shall be the Election District, and representation in the County Committee shall consist of two members elected from each Election District by the greater number of votes of the enrolled Republican voters thereof voting at the primaries.

Section 4. Official primary elections shall be held as provided in the Election Law.

Section 5. The elected State Committeemen and State Committeewoman from each Assembly District in Queens County shall be members ex-officio of the Queens County Committee and the Assembly District Committee in the Assembly District where such State Committeemen and Committeewomen are elected. They shall have no vote on the County Committee unless duly elected as a member of the County Committee at the primary election.

Article II

Conventions

Section 1. Delegates and alternate delegates to the State Conventions for the nomination of party candidates for public office to be voted for by all the voters of the State, shall be designated and elected, as provided by law, from each Assembly District in the County. The unit of representation to said conventions shall be prescribed by the State Committee.

Section 2. Delegates and alternate delegates to Judicial District conventions for the nomination of party candidates for the office of Justice of the Supreme Court in the Judicial District shall be designated and elected, as provided by law, from each Assembly District in the County of Queens. The unit of representation to said conventions shall be prescribed by the State Committee.

Article III

The County Committee Organization

Section 1. The County Committee shall consist of two members from each Election District within the County of Queens. Each member of the County Committee shall be an enrolled member of the Republican Party residing in the Assembly District containing the Election District in which such member is elected. The successors of the members of the existing County Committee shall be elected at the Primary to be held in the year 2025 and thereafter the members of the County Committee shall be elected biennially in odd numbered years at the same time that members of the State Committee are elected.

Section 2. No County Committee member shall have more than one vote.

Section 3. The County Committee shall meet no earlier than September 17 and no later than October 6 (unless otherwise prescribed by the Election Law) after the holding of the official primary election at which it is elected at such time and place as may be designated by the outgoing County Chairman, and at such meeting shall organize and adopt by-laws. The Chairman, or the Secretary, if designated by the Chairman, of the outgoing County Committee shall preside until a Chairman of the new County Committee is elected, and the Secretary of the outgoing County Committee shall act until a Secretary of the new County Committee is elected.

Article IV

Officers of the County Committee and Assembly District Committee

Section 1. A. The Officers of the County Committee shall consist of Chairman, First Vice Chairman, Second Vice Chairman, Four (4) additional Vice Chairpersons (listed alphabetically), Secretary, Assistant Secretary, Treasurer, Assistant Treasurer, and Sergeant-at-Arms.

Section 1. B. The officers of the Assembly District Committee shall consist of a Chairman, Vice Chairman, Secretary, Assistant Secretary, Treasurer and Sergeant-at-Arms, all of whom shall be elected as herein elsewhere provided.

Section 2. The Chairman shall preside at all meetings, and decide all questions of order, subject to appeal. In case the committee is equally divided on any question, including the vote of the Chairman, the same shall be lost. He shall perform such other duties as pertain to his office as prescribed by the rules of this committee, and by the Election Law.

Section 3. The First Vice Chairman shall act in the absence of the Chairman, or in the absence of both, the Second Vice Chairman shall act.

Section 4. The Secretary shall keep in a book provided for that purpose, the minutes of all the meetings and proceedings of the Committee; notify the members of the time and place of meeting; call the roll at the opening of each meeting and record the names of the members present and absent, to the extent permitted by law and these by-laws. After a quorum is established on motion duly made and carried a further roll call may be dispensed with. The Secretary shall also perform such other duties as may be required by the committee from time to time; and at the expiration of his term of office, or on his removal or inability to act, deliver all books or papers, or other property belonging to the Committee to his successor, or to the Committee, and shall perform such other duties as may be required by the Election Law.

Section 4. A. The Assistant Secretary shall act in the absence of the Secretary and shall assist the Secretary in the furtherance of his or her duties when called upon.

Section 5. A. The Treasurer of the County Committee shall keep a correct account of the County Committee funds in a book or records provided for that purpose; deposit all monies in such bank or banks as may be selected by the Executive Committee; pay all bills that have been directed to be paid by the Executive Committee; file all bills and vouchers for money paid by the Treasurer; cause the accounts maintained by him to be audited bi-annually by an outside accountant selected by the Chairman of the Executive Committee; render an account of the funds whenever called upon by the Executive Committee or County Committee, submit the audit reports of outside accountants to the Executive Committee when and as rendered and comply with

the provisions of the law; and at the expiration of his term of office or on his removal or inability to act, deliver all books, papers and vouchers, or other property in his possession belonging to the County Committee, and pay over all balances in his hands to his duly elected or appointed successor.

Section 5. B. The Assistant Treasurer shall have all the powers and functions of the Treasurer during the absence or disability of the Treasurer.

Section 6. The Treasurer of the Assembly District Committee shall keep a correct account of the Assembly District Committee; pay all bills that have been directed to be paid by the Assembly District Committee; file all bills and vouchers for money paid by him; render an account of the funds whenever called upon by the Assembly District Committee and comply with the provisions of the law; and at the expiration of his term of office or on his removal or inability to act, deliver all books, papers and vouchers, or other property in his possession belonging to the Assembly District committee, and pay over all balances in his hands to his duly elected or appointed successor.

Section 7. The Sergeant-at-Arms shall assist the Chairman in preserving and maintaining order.

Section 8. In the event of a vacancy in any of the elected offices, except the Chairman, enumerated in Section 1 of this article, occurring by the death, resignation, disqualification, inability or refusal to act of the incumbent, then a successor of such incumbent shall be duly elected by the Executive Committee as herein provided, at a meeting to be held for that purpose not more than sixty days after such office becomes vacant. Until such successor shall be elected, the Chairman may appoint a member to fill such vacancy, and such appointee shall hold office until such successor is duly elected.

In the event of a vacancy in the office of Chairman occurring by death, resignation, disqualification, inability or refusal to act of the incumbent then a successor of such incumbent shall be duly elected by the County Committee as herein provided, at meeting to be held for that purpose, on the call of the First Vice Chairman of the County Committee, not more than sixty days after such office becomes vacant. Until such successor shall be elected, the First Vice Chairman shall exercise the powers of the Chairman. Should the First Vice Chairman be unable or refuse to act under these circumstances, then the Second Vice Chairman may exercise the powers of the Chairman.

Article V

Committees of County Committee

Section 1. The Standing Committee of the County Committee shall be an Executive Committee.

Section 2. The Executive Committee shall be composed of the officers of the County Committee, who shall also serve as the officers of the Executive Committee, and the members of the Republican State Committee from each Assembly District in the County of Queens, and the Chairman of the Assembly District Committee in each Assembly District. No one member shall have more than one vote

Section 3. The Executive Committee shall have general management of Party affairs; shall have custody, management and control of the property, funds and headquarters of the County Committee; shall recommend dates and place for holding primaries and special elections, and meetings for designations of candidates and provide suitable places for holding meeting for the designation of candidates for office positions except those relating to Assembly Districts.

Section 4. The Executive Committee shall establish and maintain headquarters, and it shall have authority to appoint or employ such clerical and other assistance as it may deem necessary. It shall be the duty of the Chairman of the Executive Committee to report the proceedings concerning the management of political affairs of the County Committee at its meetings,

Section 5. The Chairman of the Executive Committee shall have the authority to appoint all committees and the Chairpersons of such committees as he or she shall deem necessary. Committees and the Chairpersons of such Committees shall serve at the will of the Chairman of the Executive Committee and shall report to the Chairman and the Executive Committee.

Section 6. The members of the Executive Committee pursuant to Section 6-120 of the Election Law may issue a certificate of authorization for any candidate seeking public office for countywide office or any public office wholly or partially contained within the County of Queens.

Article VI

Meetings

Section 1. All meetings of the County Committee shall be held at such time and place at the call of the Chairman of the County Committee and shall be conducted in accordance with the order of business and Rules of Order annexed hereto.

Section 2. A meeting of the County Committee must be called by the Chairman upon written request of not less than 25 per cent of the membership of the County Committee and such meeting shall be held on the date designated in such written request upon giving notice as required by Section 3. In the absence of the Chairman such meeting shall be called by the First Vice-Chairman or the appropriate Vice-Chairman in the aforementioned order of succession.

Section 3. Notice of the time and place of all meetings of the County Committee must be mailed to each member of the committee at least five business days prior to such meeting.

Section 4. A quorum of the County Committee for the transaction of business at any meeting shall consist of 150 members; except that on the adoption of an amendment to the By-laws or the election of Officers, or the removal of any member of the committee, or declaring vacant the place of any officer, a quorum shall consist of not less than twenty (20%) percent of its elected members. Less than a quorum may adjourn to another time.

Section 5. A quorum for the transaction of business at any regular or special meeting of any standing committee or sub-committee or special committee of the County Committee (including the Executive Committee, but excluding Assembly District Committees) shall consist of a majority of the members comprising any such committee. Less than a quorum may adjourn to another time.

Section 6. The organizational meeting of the Executive Committee shall be held within 5 days after the holding of the organizational meeting of the County Committee, at such time and place as may be designated by the newly elected Chairman of the County Committee.

Section 7. Meetings of the Executive Committee may be called by its Chairman upon his own motion and must be called by the Chairman upon written request of at least 20 of its members.

Section 8. All Meetings of the Executive Committee shall be called upon 3 days' notice in writing. Less than a quorum may adjourn the meeting.

County Committee from the same Assembly District as the member executing the proxy.

Section 8. In the event of a tie vote at a meeting of the County Committee the same shall be resolved by the vote of the Chairman, provided such Chairman has not voted on the instant question or election.

Section 9. In the event of a tie vote at a meeting of the Executive Committee of the County Committee such tie vote shall be resolved by the Chairman of the County Committee, provided such chairman has not voted on the instant question or election.

Article VIII

Vacancies

Section 1. Vacancies in the membership of the County Committee accruing from any cause shall be filled by the selection of an enrolled voter qualified for election from the Assembly District in which said vacancy shall have occurred. Such enrolled voter shall be elected by a majority of the votes cast by the Assembly District Committee in the Assembly District where such Election District is situated.

Section 2. The names and addresses of all persons elected to fill such vacancies shall be forthwith as certified by the Executive Committee of the Assembly District, filed with the Chairman of the County Committee or such other person as is charged hereunder with the call of meetings of the County Committee.

Section 3. A vacancy in the nomination of a candidate for Countywide Public Office occurring after a primary election shall be filled by the Executive Committee of the County Committee.

Section 4. A vacancy in the nomination for the office of Member of the State Assembly occurring after a Primary Election shall be filled by the Assembly District committee.

Section 5. Vacancies in the nominations of Candidates for Public Office who are to be voted for by the voters of Queens County and another or other counties shall be filled in the manner prescribed by the Election Law.

Section 6. All other vacancies in the nomination of Candidates for Public office occurring after the Primary Election shall be filled by the members of the Executive Committee from the Assembly Districts contained in the political subdivision wherein said vacancy occurs.

Article VII

Voting

Section 1. In the County Committee and all its sub-committees (including Executive Committee and Assembly District committees) each member shall be entitled to one vote, except as otherwise prescribed by law.

Section 2. Except as otherwise provided by law, a vote by roll call or by ayes and nays on all questions at all meetings of the County Committee shall be taken by calling the Assembly Districts in order, when the State Committeeman or in his absence the State Committeewoman or in her absence, the Chairman of the Assembly District, having ascertained the preference of its members shall state the result by announcing the number of ayes and the number of nays cast by such members from such Assembly District; said vote all be recorded by the Secretary as the vote of said district. Should objection be taken to the Assembly District result announced, the roll is to be called so that each member may vote, and the result ascertained thereby shall stand as the vote from said district. Thereafter the Secretary shall announce the total number of ayes and the total number of nays of all the Assembly Districts, which shall be the vote of the County Committee.

Section 3. In the Executive Committee and in all other committees, the ayes and nays shall be taken by calling the roll when each member shall state his preference orally, except as provided for in Section 5 hereof.

Section 4. In the event that only one candidate is nominated for any office, the vote shall be viva voce.

Section 5. In the event two or more candidates are nominated for the same office the members shall be polled by roll call and each member shall state his choice orally.

Section 6. The vote of a majority of the votes cast at any meeting of the County Committee, an Assembly District Committee, the Executive Committee of the County Committee, and all other Committees of the County Committee shall be necessary for the determination.

Section 7. Voting by proxy by members of the County Committee is permitted. Proxies may be held and voted by the Chairman of the Executive Committee, State Committee Persons or District Chairman from the same Assembly District as the member executing the proxy, or another duly elected member of the

Section 9. The Assembly District Committee meetings may be called by the Chairman or at the written request of 25 of its members. Notice of all regular and special meetings must be given to all members, either personally or by mail, at least 5 business days previous to the time fixed for the meeting and, in case of special meetings, the subject to be considered at such meeting.

Section 10. The County Committee of each Assembly district shall meet for the purposes of organization and election of officers not earlier than September 17 after the official Primary election at which they were elected and at such time and place as designated by outgoing State Committeeman, or in his absence or disability or failure to act, by the outgoing State Committeewoman, or the outgoing Chairman of the Assembly District Committee, on 5 business days notice in writing. The newly elected State Committeeman, or in his absence or disability or failure to act, the newly elected State Committeewoman, or in her absence or disability or failure to act, any member of the Assembly District Committee designated, by the Chairman of the County Committee, shall act as Secretary at such meeting until after organization and election of officers and the adoption of Bylaws and Rules of Order.

Section 11. The following shall be the order of business of the organizational meetings of the County Committee, and the Assembly District Committees.

1. Roll Call
2. Adoption of Rules and By-laws
3. Nomination of Officers
4. Election of Officers
5. Filling of Vacancies
6. New Business
7. Adjournment

Section 12. The following shall be the order of business of the organizational meetings of the Executive Committee of the County Committee:

1. Roll Call
2. Adoption of Rules and By-Laws
3. Filling of Vacancies
4. New Business
5. Adjournment

Article IX

Discipline

Section 1. A member or officer of either the County Committee or an Assembly District Committee may be removed by such committees for disloyalty to the party, corruption in office or failure to maintain enrollment in the Party, Such member or officer may only be removed after the filing with the Executive Committee of the County Committee or of the Assembly District Committee, as the case may be, of written verified charges which shall be promptly heard by such Executive Committee or by a sub-committee appointed by such Executive Committee, after ten (10) days written notice of such hearing to the person so charged; a copy of such written verified charges shall accompany such notice. If the matter is referred to a sub-committee, such sub-committee shall report its finding to the Executive Committee for determination of the questions. The determination of the Executive Committee shall be final and binding on all parties.

Section 2. An application made by a voter to have the name of a person stricken from the Enrollment Books as not in sympathy with the principles of the Republican Party, pursuant to the Election Law must be accompanied by proof by affidavit of the specific Acts, and must be presented to the Chairman of the County Committee at least thirty days before a primary election. The procedure prescribed by the Election Law, which regulates this matter, must be strictly complied with.

Article X

Assembly District Committees

Section 1. There shall be in each Assembly District an Assembly District Committee, which shall consist of the members of the State Committee and the members of the County Committee from each Assembly District, which shall be sub-committees of the County Committee. The Assembly District Committee shall have the general care and supervision of the affairs of the Republican Party within such Assembly District under the direction of and in cooperation with the County Committee and in accordance with these by-laws.

Section 2. A quorum of an Assembly District Committee for the transaction of business at all meetings shall consist of 20 per cent of its duly elected members except that less than a quorum may adjourn any meeting to another time.

Section 3. The officers of an Assembly District Committee shall be a Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary, Assistant Secretary, Treasurer and Sergeant-at-Arms, each of whom shall be a member of the County Committee of that Assembly District and each of whom shall perform the duties usually belonging to his or her office, and such other duties as may devolve upon any of them by vote of said committee.

Section 4. Every Assembly District Committee shall have an Executive Committee which shall be composed of the members of the State Committee from each District and the Chairman of the Assembly District Committee.

Section 5. The by-laws of the County Committee shall be the by-laws of each Assembly District Committee, expressly excepting from the operation thereof such provisions and sections as may be inconsistent so far as the duties of the Assembly District Committee are concerned.

Article XI

Amendments and Procedure

Section 1. These by-laws may be amended by a majority vote of the County Committee present at a meeting at which there is a quorum, provided a copy of the proposed amendment or amendments shall be sent with the notice of the meeting at which such amendment or amendments is or are to be proposed, such notice to be not less than five business days before such meeting, and to be mailed to the post office address of such member of the County Committee.

Section 2. The Assembly District Committee may, subject to the approval of the Executive Committee of the County Committee, adopt and amend from time to time its by-laws not inconsistent with the provisions hereof, but which may be necessary for the better regulation and conduct of its affairs; no such amendments to the by-laws shall be effective until same have been approved by the Executive Committee of the County Committee, and a copy thereof as adopted and amended shall be filed with the Executive Committee,

Section 3. Amendments to the by-laws of the Assembly District shall be recommended to the Executive Committee of the County Committee by written resolution setting forth the amendment and signed by the Secretary of the District Committee and approved by the Executive Committee of the Assembly District Committee after adoption of said resolution by a majority vote of

the Assembly District Committee at a meeting where a quorum is present.

Section 4. After Consideration of said resolution the determination of the Executive Committee of the County Committee shall be certified to the Assembly District Committee by the Chairman of the Executive Committee of the County Committee, at which time the same shall become effective.

Section 5. Parliamentary practice and procedure not herein regulated shall be governed by Robert's' Rules of Order Newly Revised, however if there are any variances between then Parliamentary Practice and Procedure contained in Roberts' Rule of Order and these by-laws, then these by-laws shall prevail.

Section 6. These by-laws shall not be amended, waived or suspended except in the manner provided for in this Article.

Article XII

Resolutions


Section 1. All resolutions relating to Party Policy by the Assembly District Committee shall be referred to the Executive Committee of the County Committee for such action as it deems appropriate.

Article XIII

Rules Of Order


The following rules of order shall be the rules of order of the County Committee, the Executive Committee of the County Committee, and the Assembly District Committees and all sub-committees of any thereof: See Article XI, Section 5, above.

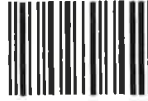
